Business need:

- After becoming the target of a largescale advanced persistent threat (APT), the organization looked to enhance its cybersecurity posture
- Network protection tools antivirus scanners and firewalls – identified the threat and isolated it, but the fact that the APT breached these tools proved the company was vulnerable
- Establishment of a centralized security operations center (SOC)
- The company wanted to evolve from a reactive security organization to a proactive one.



Solution:


- Establishment of cybersecurity processes and executives, as well as dedicated teams to handle day-to-day APT identification and response

- Implementation of a phase-based defense model to resist future attacks
- Robust training of cybersecurity resources on best practices
- Installation of an intelligence-management system that works with existing tools to centralize data and identify threats
