UK Modern Slavery Act Policy

Capgemini UK has a zero tolerance to any form of modern slavery or exploitation.

Modern slavery is a crime and a violation of fundamental human rights. It takes various forms, such as slavery, servitude, forced and compulsory labour and human trafficking. A common factor being the deprivation of a person's liberty by another to exploit them for personal or commercial gain.

Capgemini is a responsible and diverse organisation of over 350.000 team members in over fifty countries. Our business activities are delivered from our own network of offices as well as at our clients' sites and other locations. This policy applies to all employees, partners, third parties and suppliers retained by Cappemini UK. Capgemini recognises that our business activities have risks; and are committed to continually improving our performance and to working with our clients to help them reduce the risk of modern slavery and exploitation. This involves regularly consulting with key stakeholders (particularly employees, clients and suppliers) to ensure our activities are responsive to their feedback. Modern slavery risks are managed through due diligence, detection and prevention to ensure that we meet the requirements of the 2015 UK Modern Slavery Act.

- Prohibit discrimination, the unjust or prejudicial treatment of people with differing characteristics, especially on the grounds of age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage & civil partnership, pregnancy & maternity, being a carer, sexual orientation, ethnicity, religion, belief or gender
- Prohibit the confiscation of workers original identification documents
- Provide access to remedy, compensation, and justice for victims of modern slavery

Performance against our objectives and KPIs will be reviewed annually and reported publicly in our <u>Transparency Statement</u>

It is voluntary, confidential, and allows anonymity, unless stated differently by a country's local law. It ensures fairness, organisational justice, and prompt, systematic investigation. Capgemini trusts and expects SpeakUp to be used in good faith and will firmly prohibit retaliation against whomever raises or helps address a legitimate concern.
